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### I. Program outcomes

- PGO 1. Integrate advanced approaches in modern and traditional horticultural tools and techniques for sustainable development in the field
- PGO 2. Demonstrate advanced systematic knowledge and innovative skills in the field of horticulture and multidisciplinary research in a harmonious manner either locally or internationally
- PGO 3. Apply skills in a specialized field with appropriate concepts and principles to address horticultural and agricultural-related problems, and provide holistic sustainable intervention
- PGO 4. Package and transfer significant horticulture research results with integrity in analyzing and interpreting data using available advanced and accepted models, and produce publishable outputs.

### II. Type of Graduate Program

The PhD in Horticulture is an Academic Track with the following major requirement (CMO 15 s 2019)

- Passing the comprehensive examination
- Dissertation Final manuscript
- At least one (1) publication in a national or international refereed and indexed journal

# III. Admission requirements

- Must have a master's degree with a specialization in horticulture and related fields from any recognized institution and with 1-2 years of industry experience in the field of agriculture.
- Must get a PASS rating (80%) on GSAT. Applicants whose scores fall below 80 but not lower than 70% may be granted admission to the program on a probationary status and can only take 9 units or equivalent to three (3) courses. In addition, the student must not obtain failing grades or incomplete (INC) marks, and all grades should have a GWA of



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- 2.0 or better. The probationary status will only be removed and replaced with regular status after complying with these conditions at the end of the semester.
- Not vertically aligned applicants may be granted admission to the program on a probationary status and are required to carry a maximum load of 9 units and enroll in additional prerequisite or other courses as determined by the evaluation committee during the qualifying examination or by the temporary adviser. The probationary status will be replaced with regular status only when all the courses (9 units) enrolled during the first term of enrollment have been successfully completed and attained a GWA of at least 1.75.
- Must have passed the entry requirements as stipulated in the graduate school manual.
- For transferee: Must submit all credentials for transfer of credits to be evaluated by the admission committee. A maximum of 18 units (6 courses/subjects taken within the last 9 years) with a grade of at least 1.75 each or its equivalent can be credited.
- Foreign students: Submit additional documents such as the photocopy of certificate or diploma, certification of the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) with a score of at least 60 or the International English Language Testing System (IELTS) with a score of at least 6.0. Comply with other requirements by the International Affairs Division (IAD).

# IV. Retention Policy

- Student shall maintain a minimum GPA of 1.75 in any given semester
- Qualifying exam is required after 1 semester
- After completing one (1) semester, students shall submit the plar
  of course work incorporating the suggestions from the committ
  during the qualifying examination and dissertation adviser.
- Pass the Comprehensive Exam (written and oral). A GPA of a
  is required to qualify for the exam, otherwise, the student shall
  additional courses from the program offering until such time the regPA is attained.
- Student shall complete all the requirements for the degree within nine (9) years from the date of first registration. A student who shall not have finished within the maximum residency rule shall enroll in 6 units of foundation courses and 6 units of specialization courses. A two-year extension shall be granted to complete the remaining program requirements.

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V. Proof of publication is required to obtain the degree.
