

USeP passes ISO 9001:2015 recertification audit

The University of Southeastern Philippines (USeP) passed the ISO 9001:2015 Recertification Audit, conducted remotely by SOCOTEC Certification Philippines, Inc. (formerly known as AJA Registrars), last April 26-27 with no non-conformities. It can be recalled that USeP had the certification audit visit last November 3-4, 2020, and successfully passed for the immediate certification of ISO 9001:2015.

Good housekeeping in Tagum-Mabini campus registrar, immediate and competent presentation of requested documents in College of Education (CEd) and Colege of Business Administration (CBA), as well as improvement in infrastructure in Mintal campus were some of the positive findings observed by the auditees during the visit.

The auditors included Ms. Ella Riza Ajero, as Lead Auditor, as well as Mr. Eugene Herradura and Ms. Ma. Jona Anorico as Support Auditors. Dr. Mark Vera, Capt. Nicanor Altares, and Ms. Mercedelin Flores were also present as technical experts.

This achievement displayed the USeP community's collective effort and commitment towards excellence, under the leadership of the University President, Dr. Lourdes C. Generalao.

This also manifests the University's commitment to its strategic goal in ensuring that the University's processes and operations are consistently planned and implemented. This is for the purpose of optimizing effectiveness and performance, and demonstrating the University's ability to sustain a quality management system.

USeP conducts AUN-QA 101

In line with the USeP Catch-Up Plan (T06), the USeP Quality Assurance Division (QAD) conducted AUN-QA 101, an orientation on the AUN- QA frameworks and on its associated criteria for program and institutional level of accreditation last June 4 & 18, 2021 via Zoom.

The AUN-QA Network is established as the ASEAN quality assurance network for higher education with the responsibility to promote quality assurance, raise the quality of higher education, and collaborate with both regional and international bodies for the benefit of the ASEAN community.

The activity had two sessions, one held on June 4, 2021 titled "AUN-QA 101", and another held on June 18, 2021 titled "How and What of Self-Assessment Report (SAR)". AUN-QA 101 aims to orient Deans, Associate Deans, and Quality Assurance Heads, QA Heads on the AUN-QA framework as well as discuss preparations for SAR.

USask, USeP ink understanding for research, academic exchange and cooperation

In line with the celebration of the 27th Commission on Higher Education (CHED) Anniversary and the first National Higher Education Day, the University of Southeastern Philippines (USeP) joined other Philippine State Universities and Colleges (SUCs) in the virtual signing of the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) facilitated by CHED and University of Saskatchewan (USask) to promote academic and research exchange on May 19, 2021.

The MoU was also initiated to respond to academic programs' internationalization, research and development initiatives, and partnerships between and among higher education institutions in the Philippines and abroad.

Dr. J. Prospero E. De Vera III, CHED Chairperson, stated that "our continuing thrust on internationalization is bearing fruit," emphasizing the theme of the

year's CHED theme, "Padyak! Moving Forward, Claiming Victory for Philippine Higher Education. Pamantasan: Pandayan Tungo sa Kaunlaran" on claiming victory— in internationalization and mutual cooperation.

This MoU will provide more opportunities for the University to support the internationalization programs and efforts, as well as to realize and to realize the University's mission in equipping graduates to become globally competitive.

This partnership is in line with the Philippine-Canada Universities Education Consortium for International Collaborative Partnerships (PhilCanEDUCON— Magic 7+) which aims to foster academic and scholarly collaboration among USask and seven (7) SUCs in the Philippines, as follows: Mariano Marcos State University (MMSU); Benguet State University (BSU); Central Luzon State University (CLSU); Central Mindanao University (CMU);

Central Mindanao University (CMU); Don Mariano Marcos Memorial State University (DMMMSU); Mountain Province Polytechnic State College (MPPSC); and University of Southeastern Philippines (USeP).

For the furtherance and realization of the Strategic Area of Concern (SAC) 1, as indicated in the University's Catch-Up Plan (CUP) 2018-2021, the University of Southeastern Philippines conducted (USeP) the Program orientation on to Institutionalize Meritocracy Excellence in Human R and Resource Management (PRIME-HRM). Director II Marilyn M. Dujali from the Civil Service Commission (CSC) XI was the resource speaker for the orientation which was held virtually in April 2021.

Administrative Council members, Human Resource Management Division (HRMD) counterparts from Mintal, Tagum-Mabini Campuses, and the University Budget Officer participated in the orientation. The orientation is in preparation for one of the performance measures of SAC 1, which is the recognition of the University as a Center for Excellence in Human Resource Management, by the CSC, by the end of 2021.

PRIME-HRM is a program that integrates and enhances the Personnel Management Assessment and Assistance Program (PMAAP) and the CSC Agency Accreditation Program (CSCAAP), and a mechanism to assess the maturity level of an agency's HR systems.

Prevention is better than cure: USeP CAS conducts vaccination information drive

Aside from the threat of COVID-19 pandemic on public health and economy, the public is swayed to doubt the effectiveness of the readily-allowed vaccines — posing a possibility of delaying the country's recovery.

To inform and educate the general public of the importance of vaccination, the University of Southeastern Philippines, through the College of Arts and Sciences (CAS), and in partnership with the Department of Health Region XI, organized a webinar series centered on COVID Pandemic with first installment about 'Vaccination Politics: The Misleading Info and Half-Truths' series, on June 18, 2021, via Zoom and was livestreamed through CAS' Official Facebook Page.

This webinar aimed to support the public health community in keeping people safe and informed with the most accurate and up-to-date details of the pandemic. This is for the purpose of ridding misleading and harmful information, supporting health and economic relief efforts, and keeping people connected in all aspects

Dr. Bonifacio G. Gabales, Jr., USeP Vice President for Academic Affairs, mentioned in his speech said that prevention is better than cure. cure. He also lauded the role of the University as an active partner of the government in cushioning the negative impact of the pandemic, as well as the rampant misinformation. In addition, he expressed his hopes for the country to achieve the herd immunity, so that the University can finally return to conducting face-to-face classes.

Cabinet Secretary Karlo Alexi B. Nograles, along with the COVID-19 Vaccination Head of the Department of Health XI, Dr. Janis Olavides, were invited as resource speakers to discuss the COVID-19 Vaccination Roadmap and the challenges experienced by the Davao Region in ensuring the access to vaccines.

Secretary Nograles, in his message, emphasized that all readily-available vaccines had undergone, in his words, 'stringent- most stringent' selection process to ensure the safety and efficacy of the vaccines. He also

guaranteed that the vaccines used in vaccination programs are approved by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and that there is no need to hesitate. Dr. Olavides likewise talked about the available vaccines and their efficacy.

USeP is with the efforts of the government to curb misinformation and achieve herd immunity to eventually end the COVID-19.

No to unlawful uploading: USeP conducts virtual information drive on R.A. 8293

Pursuant to the University Memorandum 20210511-01, the University of Southeastern Philippines (USeP), through the Office of Student Affairs and Services (OSAS), conducted a virtual information drive on May 26, 2021, via Zoom and livestreamed via the University's Official Facebook Page.

The said memorandum was issued on May 11, 2021, after the University had received news about the unlawful uploading and sharing of academic documents and other copyrighted creations on websites not recognized by the University, sans prior consent or authority from the author/s or the university.

Engr. Filmann T. Simpao, Director of the Knowledge and Technology Transfer Division (KTTD) of the University, along with Ms. Ann Marah Mencidor of Intellectual Property Property Office of the Philippines (IPOPHL) were invited as resource speakers.

The academic applications of Republic Act (R.A.) 8293, otherwise known as Intellectual Property Code of the Philippines as amended by R.A. 9150, R.A. 9502, and R.A. 10372 were discussed in the activity as well as the responsibilities of the student body and concerned individuals in compliance with the said republic act . This is to proactively avoid the violation of the provisions of the aforementioned laws.

Furthermore, the University had taken actions against those who unlawfully uploaded and shared copyrighted materials from unrecognized websites, by publicly calling their attention to take down and remove the said materials.

Through this activity, the University demonstrates its commitment on upholding its academic integrity and its core value of professionalism.

USeP Publication Unit conducts training on publishing in high impact journals

The University, through the USeP Publication Unit, conducted a Training on Publishing in High Impact Journals last May 27-28, 2021 via Zoom and and livestreamed via the USeP Publication Unit Official Facebook Page.

The two-day activity, which was participated by the faculty from different the colleges of the University and those with complete yet unpublished studies, aimed to improve the skills of the researchers in publishing articles in high impact journals.

During the first day of the training, Dr. Shirley S. Villanueva, Vice President for Research Development and Extension, commended the Research Division for organizing the activity. In her opening remarks, Dr. Villanueva highlighted that it is very necessary for research studies from the University to be disseminated to stakeholders and to other academic communities, making the activity very relevant to the University's goal of becoming a premiere research institution.

The first topic was Creating Open Researcher and Contributor ID (ORCID) delivered by Dr. Maureen M. Villamor, Southeastern Philippines Journal of Research and Development (SPJRD) Editor. Dr. Villamor discussed the importance of creating ORCID, noting that it distinguishes a researcher from others adding that it is also required by major journal publishers and funding organizations. She also demonstrated the procedure in registering a unique and free ORCID.

Following Dr. Villamor's discussion, Dr. Rodney C. Jubilado, Chair of the Humanities Division at the University of

Hawaii at Hilo, talked about Scopus and Clarivate Publishing.

Dr. Jubilado stressed that research is an important factor that makes Universities excel in any field and become the definition of excellence. He also provided important points that researchers should remember when submitting to high impact journals such as Scopus and Clarivate.

Dr. Takashi Tsuji, researcher from the College of Agriculture at Saga University, Japan, shared his experiences in writing Philippine culture for research publications. Dr. Tsuji emphasized the importance of seeking original perspectives and expressing these ideas in papers, books, and documents.

Following Dr. Tsuji, Dr. Siti Hamin Stapa, Professor of Applied Linguistics at the National University of Malaysia, discussed the Easing the Apprehensions, Reducing the rejections: Tips on Publishing in High Impact Journals. Dr. Stapa highlighted that publishing in high impact journals allows the protection of the quality of the journal, since articles are being verified as scientifically reliable. She also shared factors to consider in ranking a journal and to avoid getting rejected by research publications.

Dr. Mohammed H. Alaqad, Senior Lecturer and Academic Program Manager of Translation and Interpreting and Faculty Research Coordinator at the Management and Science University, Malaysia, talked about choosing Scopus Journals. Dr. Alaqad shared important factors to consider in deciding between an open access and traditional journal.

The writeshop began during the morning session of the second day of the activity, and was followed by the presentation of revised journal articles.

This activity demonstrates the importance of scholarly activities in academic institutions, thus manifesting the University's commitment to becoming a premier research University in the ASEAN.

To discuss the current initiatives of the government for the economic recovery of the country amidst the COVID-19 pandemic, the University of Southeastern Philippines (USeP), through College of Applied Economics (CAEc) Graduate School students, in collaboration with Socio-Economic Research and Data Analytics Center (SERDAC) Mindanao, launched a 2-part webinar series program "WISER— Webinars Econometrics Socio-Economics. Research" on May 29 and June 5, 2021 via Zoom.

Ms. Dorothy Joy A. Diaz, Bank Officer II in-charge of Economic and Financial Learning Center of Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas Davao Regional Office (BSP-RXI), along with Ms. Angel Kris B. Tacardon, CPA (Revenue Officer III), Mr. Jonicris O. Almazan, CPA (Revenue Officer III),

Ms. Almena C. Macasa, CPA (Revenue Officer II), and Ms. Jelly O. Daffon, CPA (Revenue Officer I), were invited to talk for the first webinar.

The speakers centered the discussion on the two (2) new laws that facilitate the economic recovery of the country, namely the Financial Institutions Strategic Transfer (FIST) Act and the Corporate Recovery and Tax Incentives for Enterprises (CREATE) Act, which were put into effect on February 18 and April 11, 2021 respectively. More specifically, the speakers shared how these new laws help the corporations, banks, and other financial institutions in improving the business recovery and financial system liquidity. This is very significant in keeping the country's economy afloat despite the adverse impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic.



GS CARS organizes a webinar on Ecological Rice Pest Management

The Graduate School of the College of Agriculture and Related Sciences (CARS) organized a webinar titled "Ecological Rice Pest Management" on April 24, 2021, via Zoom. The invited speaker was Dr. Ravindra C. Joshi, senior consultant of the Philippine Rice Research Institute (PhilRice) and mentor of the Meryl Williams Fellowship, ACIAR, Australia.

Dr. Joshi's presentation focused on the current status of the global rice production ecological management of invasive rice pests— specifically the rice planthopper, rice field rat, and invasive (Golden) Apple snail; and ecological engineering. He shared his experiences with various organizations, most notably the PhilRice, where he worked for many years and in different stages of his life. Further, he shared specific opportunities such as research problems, collaborative partnerships, and scholarships available for undergraduate and graduate students and faculty members.
